

Rowan's Law

Rowan Stringer was just 17 when she died on May 8th, 2013, on Mother's Day, after suffering what proved to be a fatal concussion during a high school rugby game in Ottawa. It was her second concussion within a week.

The coroner's inquest that followed cast a harsh light on youth sports organizations, pointing to a lack of protocols that experts say must be addressed to keep our kids safe.

As a result, the Club requires that anyone under the age of 26 participating in Club activities sign a form acknowledging that they have reviewed a Concussion Awareness Resource within the previous 12 months.

In the case of a person under the age of 18 the form has to be signed by the parent or guardian, acknowledging that they have reviewed a Concussion Awareness Resource within the previous 12 months on behalf of the child or ward.
